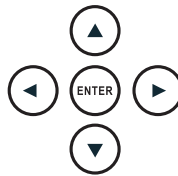

Menu Navigation

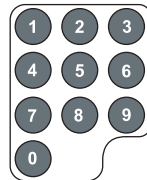
To navigate DVD disc menus or the player's setup menus:

- Press the DIRECTION keys (arrows) to select a desired feature or option in the menu.
- Press ENTER to confirm a selection in the menu.
 - For some menu options, you may be able to use the numeric keypad to input data.
- Press  to cancel an entry.



Numeric Keypad

- Use the numeric keypad to skip directly to a DVD chapter or CD track. (Some discs may not allow direct access function.)
- Use the numeric keypad to input numeric data in menu option fields when possible.



Disc Error Messages

The following messages will be displayed on-screen if there is a problem with the format of the loaded disc.

- WRONG PASSWORD.** The parental rating level of the disc is higher than the parental rating level setting of the player. The player will not play the disc.
- Invalid Disc .** The player is equipped with automatic disc quality detection software. If the player detects a disc that is damaged or has a format problem, it may play the disc at a lower quality or stop play completely, depending on how damaged the disc is.
- DTS Discs:** This player does not have a built-in DTS decoder.
 - Connect to a digital amplifier using a Digital Audio Connection (optical or coaxial) to enjoy DTS audio discs.
 - Select Dolby 5.1 or 2-Channel Stereo Downmix instead of the DTS setting.

Note:

DVD disc production quality may vary; some discs may deviate from the industry standard. Some incorrectly-formatted discs may still play, however, the playback and operational quality of the disc may be substandard.

Power Management

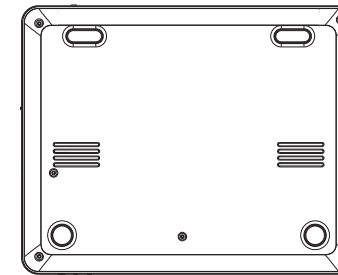
If the player will not be in use for a long period of time, set the Power Switch to the OFF position, unplug the player, and remove the batteries from the remote control.

Rechargeable Battery Pack

****For new or exhausted rechargeable battery pack, we recommend it be recharged for 4 hours.**

To charge the battery, just connect the AC adapter.

Do not attempt to replace or repair the battery by yourself unless you are a qualified service personnel.

**** The battery can be recharged about 300 times without obvious performance drop. ****

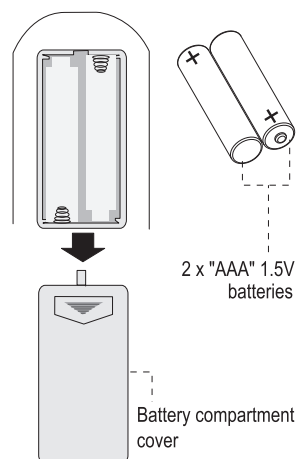
Note:

- Only use original ML7300 charger.
- Never dispose of in fire or heat up.
- Do not use in high temperature or near heat sources.
- Do not open the cover. Refer servicing only to qualified service personnel.
- Do not charge up the battery pack while the DVD player is working with the battery pack.
- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

Low Battery Detection: The unit will auto stop and turn to STANDBY mode when voltage reaches too low.

Remote Control

- Refer to the diagram. Remove the battery compartment cover located on the rear of the remote control. Insert batteries, making sure to match their polarities (+/-) to the markings on the inside of the compartment. Replace the cover.
- To use the remote, point it at the remote sensor of the player. Operate the remote within 15 feet of the sensor and at an angle of +/- 60 degrees.
- Batteries in the remote will last for approximately 1 year. Replace the batteries if the remote control does not work. Do not mix old with new batteries, or different types of batteries.
- Remove the batteries from the remote if it will not be used for a long period of time.



WARNING

- The batteries used in the remote control may present a fire or chemical burn if mistreated. Do not recharge, disassemble, incinerate, or heat the battery (~ 100°C)
- Keep batteries away from children.

Power Supply

This unit should be used with 100-240V 50/60Hz AC wall outlets, only.

Caution:

- Do not connect the power plug to a power outlet other than that which is indicated here and on the label as this may result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Do not handle the power plug with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock.

Basic Playback

- Prepare the connections and power supply.
- Load a disc.
Open the DVD cover by hand, place a disc into the disc tray with the label side facing up, close the cover by hand.
 - If a single-sided disc is inserted upside-down, the player will display "NO DISC" or "Invalid Disc".
- Start playback.
Press PLAY to start playback (some discs may start playing automatically).

Play/Pause/Stop

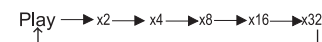
- Press to play the disc for the first time.
- Press during playback to pause. Press again to resume playback.
- Press during playback to stop the disc ("Pre-Stop"). Press to resume playback at the time-point at which the disc was stopped.
- Press when the disc is "Pre-Stopped" to stop playback completely. (When is pressed, the disc will start playing from the beginning.)

Previous/Next (Skip)

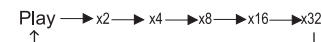
- Press to skip to the next track (DVD, CD, etc).
- Press to return to the previous track (DVD, CD, etc).

Forward/Reverse (Search)

- Repeatedly press the button to search fast forward through a disc.



- Repeatedly press the button to search fast backward through a disc.



Slow

- Press SLOW for slow-motion playback. Each successive press of SLOW will change the rate of slow-motion playback. Press to resume normal playback.

Play → x 1/2 → x 1/4 → x 1/8 → x 1/16 → 1/32

Press STEP frame-by-frame playback. Each successive press of STEP will advance the video one frame. Press to resume normal playback.

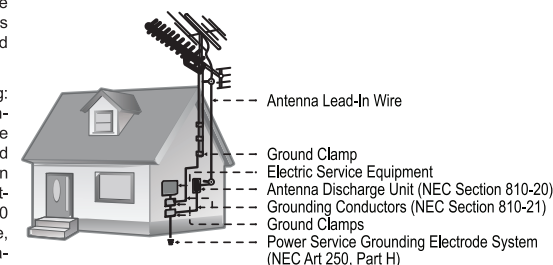

Audio will be muted during fast-forward, fast-reverse, and slow-motion playback.

TROUBLESHOOTING

There is no sound or distorted sound.

- Ensure that the TV and amplifier have been turned on and properly set up.
- Ensure that the TV and amplifier connections are secure and correct.
- Try a different Audio track of the DVD by pressing AUDIO.
- Ensure that the MUTE function of the TV, Amplifier, or Player is not engaged.

The remote control doesn't work.

- Ensure that the Power Switch has been physically set to the ON position.
- Ensure that there are no obstacles between the remote and the player.
- Point the remote at the remote sensor on the main unit.
- Ensure that the batteries in the remote retain a charge and have been installed correctly.
- Try replacing the remote's batteries.

The player has malfunctioned.

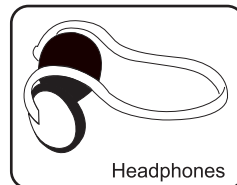
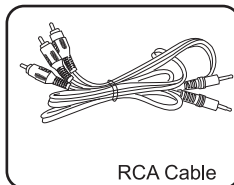
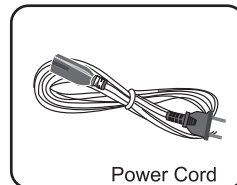
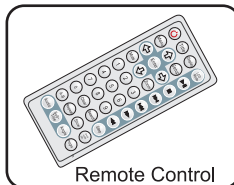
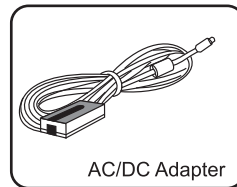
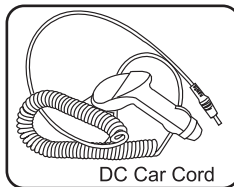
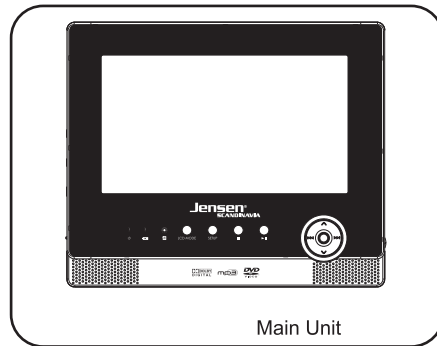
- Unplug the player. After 30 minutes, plug in and power on the player -- the restore function should reset the player.

There is no power to the device.

- Ensure that the Power Switch on the main unit is physically set to the ON position.
- Ensure that the AC adapter cord is securely connected to the player and the proper wall outlet.

The device will not play the disc.

- Ensure that a supported disc is loaded in the player label-side up.
- Ensure that the disc's rating level does not exceed the player's parental rating level.
- Ensure that the disc is not damaged or too dirty. Clean the disc or try another disc.
- Moisture may have condensed inside the player. Remove the disc and leave the player on for 1-2 hours and then try again.

There is no picture.

- Ensure that the TV set has been powered on and is set to the correct AV mode.
- Ensure that the connections between the player and the TV are secure and correct.
- Check if the connection cables are damaged.
- Restore the player to it's factory-default settings: open the disc tray, and then press PROGRAM and ZOOM together.

The picture is noisy or distorted.

- The disc may be damaged or dirty. Clean the disc or try another one.
- Reset your TV's color system.
- Ensure that the player is connected directly to the TV (and not through a VCR, cable box, satellite receiver, etc.)

The picture is not full-screen.

- Change the aspect ratio setting of your player from the Setup menu.
- Select a different aspect ratio option from the DVD disc menu.

Disc Care and Maintenance

Optical discs (DVDs, CDs) contain high-density compressed data and need proper handling.

Handling a Disc

- Hold a DVD/CD by its edges. Avoid touching the recorded side of the disc. To remove a DVD/CD from its storage case, press down on the center retention mechanism of the case and lift the disc out.
- Do not subject discs to prolonged exposure to direct sunlight, high humidity, or high temperatures.
- Do not bend or press discs.
- To reduce the risk of scratches, always put discs back in their case after use. Store discs vertically in a cabinet.
- Do not place stickers or labels on either side of a disc.



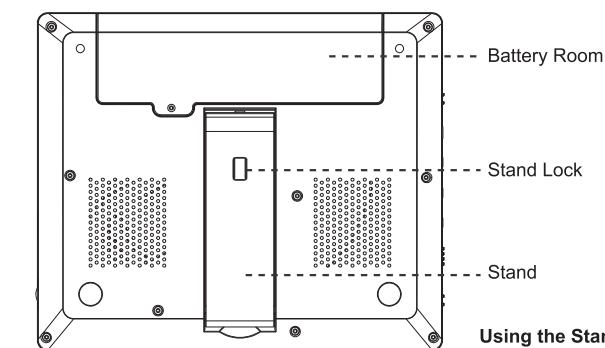
Cleaning a Disc

Use a dry, soft cloth to wipe off any fingerprints and dusts from the playing surface of the disc. Wipe in a straight line radially from the center to the outside edge of the disc. Small dust particles and light stains will not affect playback quality.



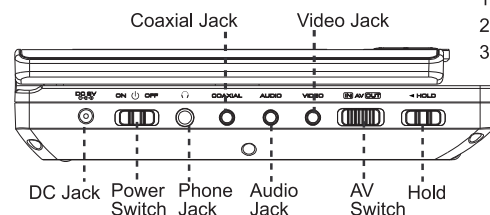
Never use chemicals such as record sprays, anti-static sprays, benzene, or thinners to clean a disc. Doing so will damage the surface of the disc permanently.

Using the Stand

1. Lift up the stand from the base recess.
2. Support the unit against the stand.
3. Set the lock switch to "On".

Set the power on/off.

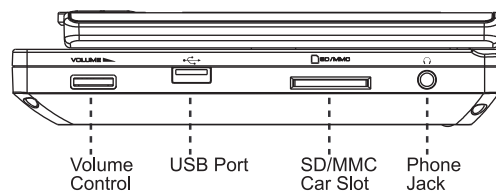

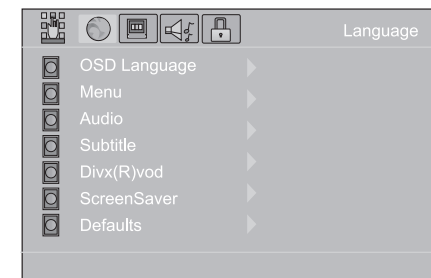

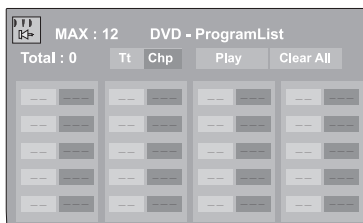

PLAYER FUNCTIONS

Program Function

Press the "Program" button to display the program menu. (eg: DVD mode)

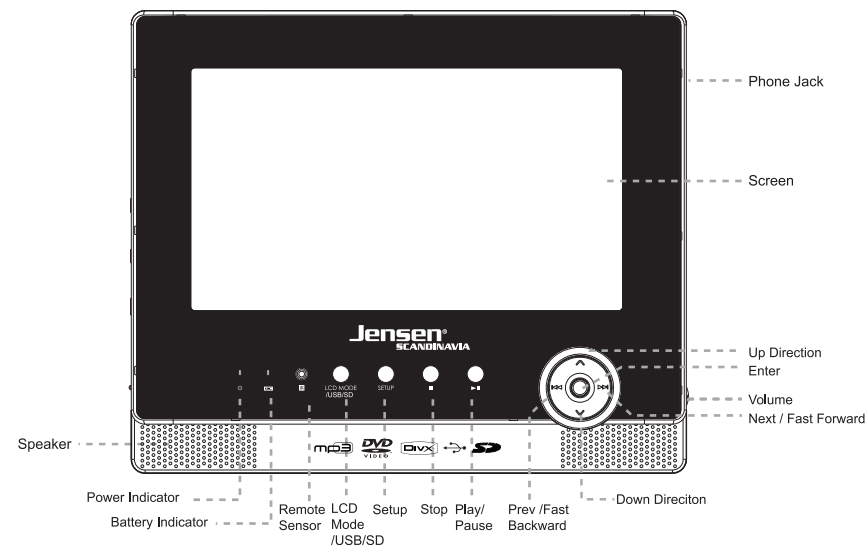


1. Press the DIRECTION buttons to move between entries.
2. Press the NUMBER buttons to input data
3. To delete the incorrect input, press the CLEAR or ENTER button.
To delete all programs, select "Clear All" and press ENTER.
4. Press Play/Pause to start playback or select "Play" from the menu and press ENTER.
5. To cancel, press Program twice.

USB/SD/MMC-Card Access

Press the DVD/USB/SD button on the remote to display the working source menu,
You also can access this menu by holding the LCDMODE/USB/SD button on the main unit for a short while.
Press the up/down direction button to select DVD/USB/Card from the menu, press ENTER to access.

LOCATION OF CONTROLS



For your reference:

1. Place a disc with the label facing up and push gently on the center of the disc so it goes into position.
2. To start playing, press the PLAY/PAUSE button. (Some discs will start playing automatically).
3. To stop playing, press the STOP button.
4. To Skip Forward/Skip Backward, press the NEXT/PREV button.
5. To Fast Forward/Fast Backward, press/hold the NEXT/PREV button.

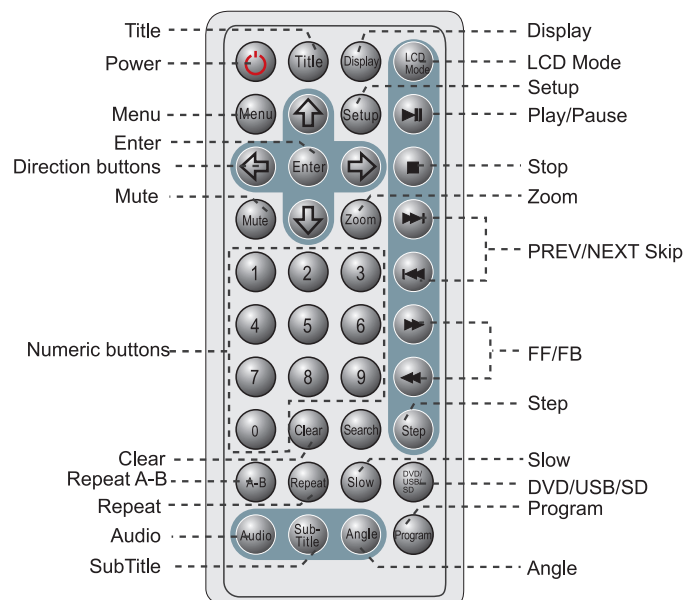
LCD Mode/USB/SD Button

Briefly press this button to display the LCD menu, you can adjust screen effect through the LCD menu.

Press and hold this button for a short while to display the working source menu, you can access the DVD/USB/Card using this menu.

LOCATION OF CONTROLS

Remote control surface



The remote control transmits a directional infrared beam. Be sure to aim the remote control directly at the infrared remote sensor during operation. The sensor may not be able to receive signals properly if the sensor is covered, if there is a large object between the remote control and the sensor, or if it is exposed to direct sunlight or a strong artificial light (e.g., fluorescent or strobe lights). In this case, change the direction of the light or reposition the unit to avoid direct lighting.

PLAYER FUNCTIONS

CLEAR

Press the Clear button to cancel the incorrect input in DVD program .

SEARCH

Go to a desired section through SEARCH function.
Press the Search button to show below picture.

DVD Mode



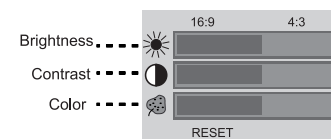
CD Mode



1. Press the direction buttons to move between entries.
2. Press the number buttons to input data. To cancel the incorrect input, press the Clear button.
3. Press ENTER or the Play/pause button to execute the search.
4. Press the Search button to quit.

LCD Mode

Press the LCD Mode button to display the LCD menu.



Press the up/down direction button to select the desired item, press the left/right direction button to make adjustment.

When SCREEN is selected, press the left/right button to change the screen dimension as 16:9 or 4:3.
When RESET is selected, press ENTER to confirm, the above three control bars will be reverted to the factory default.

PLAYER FUNCTIONS

Repeat A-B Mode

To repeat a specific section of a disc (play on a loop):

1. Press A-B to set the desired start point ("A") of the section to be repeated.
2. Press A-B again to set the desired end point ("B") of the section to be repeated.
3. The section "A-B" will now play repeatedly as a loop. Press A-B again to resume normal playback.

Multi-Angle/Subtitle/Audio

- During playback of a DVD that has been mastered with multiple angles, press ANGLE to view the available alternate camera angles. (A DVD may have up to 9 selectable angles.)
- During playback of a DVD that has been mastered with subtitles, press SUBTITLE to view the available subtitle tracks. (A DVD may have up to 32 selectable subtitles.)
- During playback of a DVD that has been mastered with alternate language/audio tracks, press AUDIO to hear the alternate tracks. (A DVD may have up to 8 selectable audio tracks.)

Zoom

Press ZOOM to change the magnification level of the picture.

- During DVD playback, each successive press of ZOOM will change the level of magnification to: 2X → 3X → 4X → 1/2X
- During JPEG CD playback, each successive press of ZOOM will change the level of magnification to: 2X → 3X → 4X → 1/2X

When the magnification level is greater than Normal/100%, use the NAVIGATION keys to pan around the magnified picture.

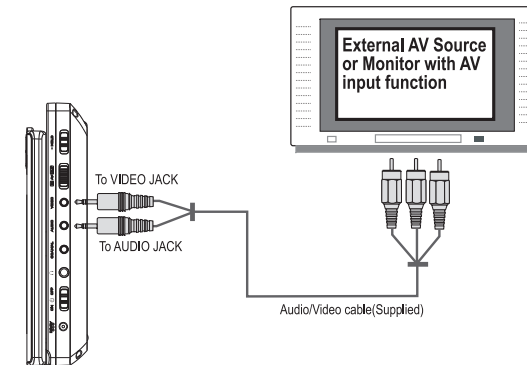
Note: The picture quality will decrease as the zoom level (magnification) increases.

Audio/Video Connections

Slide the AV switch to AV IN to input the AV signal

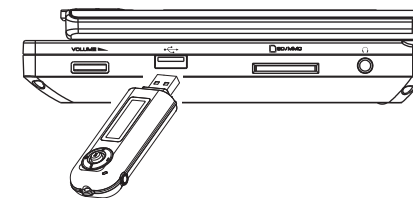
Slide the AV switch to AV OUT to output the AV signal



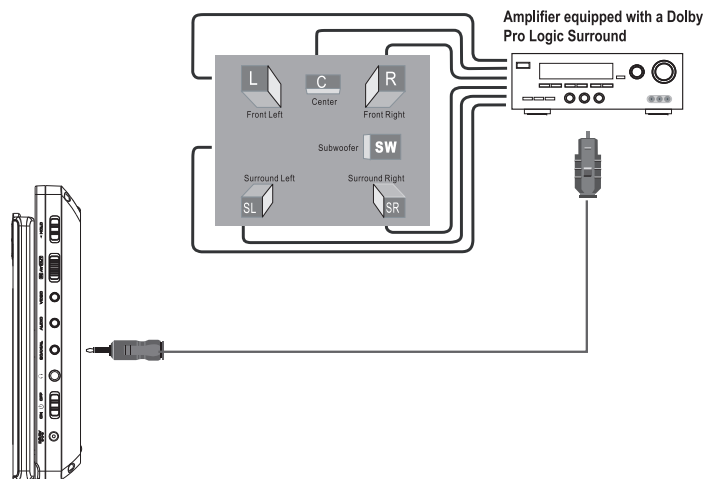
1. Refer to the owner's manual of the external device as well.
2. Before connecting the power source, be sure to have all necessary connections properly done.
3. If the player will not be used for a long period of time, disconnect the power and remove the battery from the remote control.

USB/SD/MMC-Card Connection

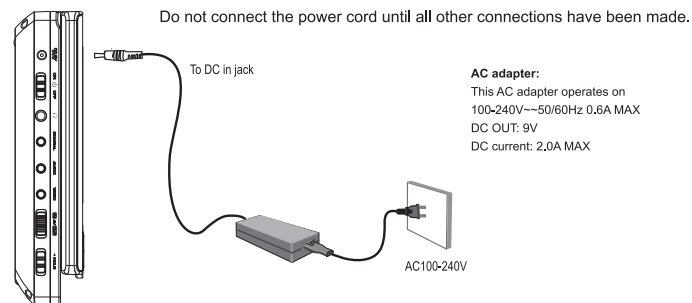
1. Insert the USB/SD Card into the corresponding slot on the unit's side panel, press and hold the LCD MODE/USB/SD button on the unit's panel or briefly press the DVD/USB/SD button on the remote to display the DVD/USB/Card select menu. Press the up/down direction button to select USB or Card from the menu, press ENTER to access.
2. It takes a short while for the unit's reading data. After the device is detected, the screen will display the working menu, press the direction buttons to select the desired file from the menu and press Play/Pause to start playback.

Power is supplied through the provided appropriate power adapter, one end of which is connected to the DC IN jack on the main unit, another to wall outlet with AC100-240V.

Note:

- If you have difficulty inserting the plug, turn it over and reinsert it.
- If the unit will not be in use for long periods of time, disconnect the plug from the outlet.
- In order to prolong the operation life, the intervals of continuous power on should be not less than 30s.

Menu / Title

- Press the MENU key during DVD playback to return to the disc's Main menu.
- Press the TITLE key during DVD playback to return to the disc's Title menu.

Setup

Press the SETUP key to enter the player's setup menu. Enter the Setup menu to adjust the player's internal settings; please see the [SETUP](#) section for more details.

Display

Repeatedly press the Display key to show the playback information.
To quit the display mode, keep pressing the Display button to finish the show.

Repeat Mode

Press REPEAT to change the repeat mode of the player. Each successive press of REPEAT will change the mode as follows:

	DVD Mode	CD Mode
REPEAT x1	Repeat All	Repeat All
REPEAT x2	Repeat Title	Repeat Track
REPEAT x3	Repeat Chapter	Repeat Off
REPEAT x4	Repeat Off	

Note:

Some DVD discs do not allow Repeat mode.
